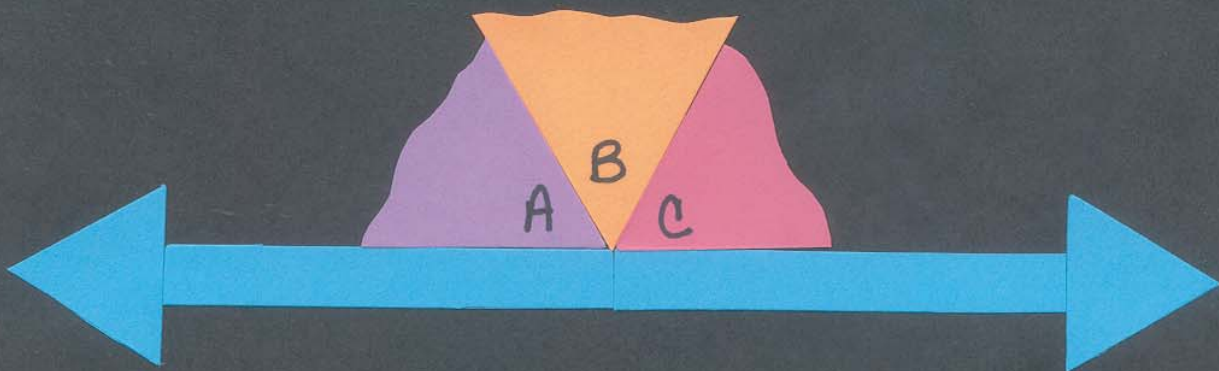
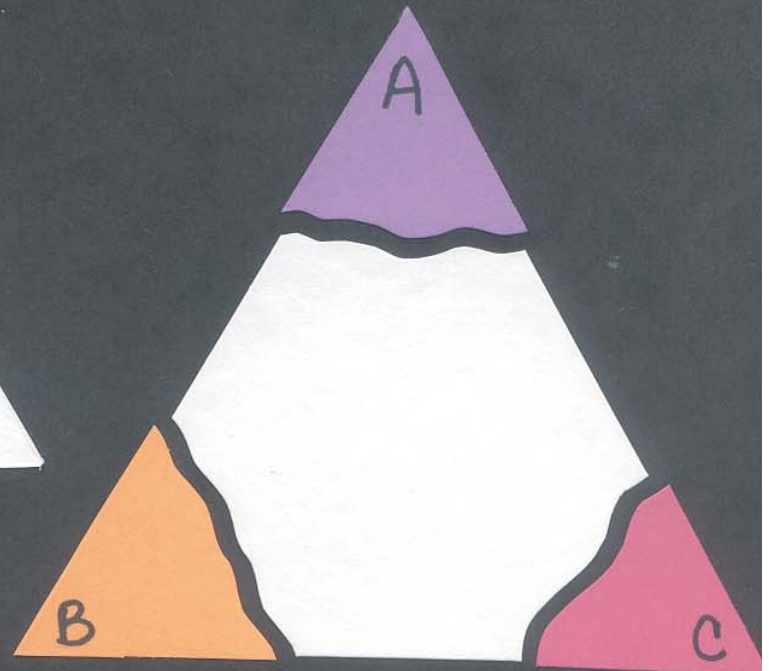
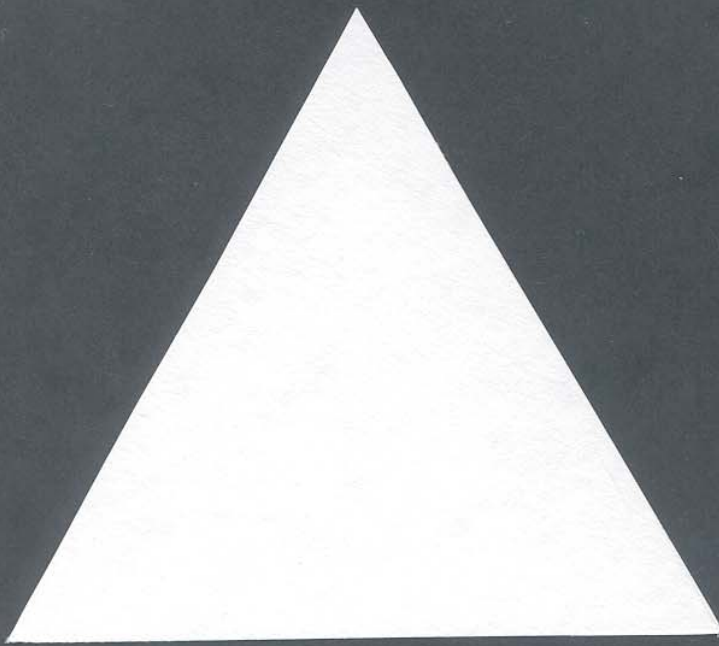


Angle Sums for Triangles

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If you were to take a triangle and label each corner A, B, and C, as shown above, then tear off each of those corners and lay them on a straight line so that their points or vertices touch each other, you would see that a triangle has the sum of 180° because a straight line is 180° .
