Exams: All exams will be in class. The tentative exam dates are Friday, February 12, Friday, March 11, and Friday, April 15. I will communicate any changes in class and in writing. The final exam is on Monday, May 2, from 2:00 PM to 3:50 PM. You must tell me in writing by Monday, April 25, if you have a university-approved conflict with the final exam time; if you do not meet that deadline, you may not be allowed to take a conflict exam, and if you are, you will have your score decreased up to 15% as a penalty. I cannot give a conflict exam if you do not have a university-approved conflict. Make up exams are available only if permission is given by me prior to the regularly scheduled exam.

Online homework: Online homework will be assigned after each class period and will be due once a week. You are expected to complete all online homework by due dates, and I do not accept late online homework, nor do I drop any grades. You can ask me if you have extenuating circumstances; I will be more generous if it is a one-time problem. You will use WebAssign to do the online homework. You should print out the WebAssign assignment well in advance of the due date and write your work on paper before trying to enter answers online. Computer or network difficulties will not be excused for late homework.

Written homework: One short written homework will be assigned in class each week, usually but not necessarily announced in advance. I do not accept late written homework, nor do I drop any grades. Missed written homework can only be made up for unavoidable absences such as serious illness or official university business. Proper documentation is required. You are encouraged to work with others, but be sure to write up your own solutions.

**Grading**: There are two schemes, and for each student, I will pick the one that gives the higher grade.
