Course Description

Calculus is intimately connected to the study of measurement and approximation. For this reason calculus is fundamental to the study of many disciplines such as physics, engineering and economics. Our aim in this course is to ensure that you understand the concepts and tools of calculus; that you master the skills required to use those tools; and that you will be able to apply those ideas to solve problems in many disciplines.

Prerequisites: A satisfactory score (minimum 75) on the ALEKS placement exam, or a grade of C or better in either MATH 1613 or MATH 1715.

Expectations

Each student is expected to be an active participant in class by asking and answering questions. During class, the use of cellphones, tablets, and laptops is prohibited. In addition to the time spent during class you should expect to spend an additional 8 hours each week studying for this course.

Homework

Each week you will have WebAssign homework due. Pay attention to the WebAssign calendar for the exact due dates. Occasionally you will be given a written homework assignment during class which will be due during the next class. Keep a homework notebook where you work out WebAssign problems and bring this notebook with you to office hours if you need help.

Quizzes

In this course you will occasionally have unannounced quizzes. These quizzes will be given during the last 20 minutes of class and you are allowed to use your notes during these quizzes. Each quiz will be about 5 problems in length and may cover any material in the course prior to that day.

Exams

There will be two midterms and a final exam in this class. Dates for these exams will be announced during class.

Make-Ups: Make-Ups for exams will be given only in extreme circumstances. Valid reasons will require documentation and include,

- 1. University Activities (Research presentations, athletic teams, etc.)
- 2. Military Obligation, Jury Duty, or other mandatory court appearance
- 3. Serious illness or injury to the student or an immediate family member.

Students should contact the instructor to schedule a make-up no later than the day after the missed exam.
