Exams: All exams will be in class. The tentative exam dates are Friday, September 18, Friday, October 16, and Friday, November 20. I will communicate any changes in class and in writing. The final exam is on Monday, December 7, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. You must tell me in writing by November, 27, if you have a university-approved conflict with the final exam time; if you do not meet that deadline, you may not be allowed to take a conflict exam, and if you are, you will have your score decreased up to 15% as a penalty. I cannot give a conflict exam if you do not have a university-approved conflict. Make up exams are available only if permission is given by me prior to the regularly scheduled exam.

Homework: It is impossible to learn calculus without practicing it. Homework will be assigned after each class period. You are expected to complete all homework by announced due dates in class, and I do not accept late homework, nor do I drop any grades. You can ask me if you have extenuating circumstances; I will be more generous if it Is a one-time problem. You will use WebAssign to do the homework. You should print out the WebAssign assignment well in advance of the due date and write your work on paper before trying to enter answers online. Computer or network difficulties will not be excused for late homework. You are encouraged to work with others, but be sure to write up your own solutions.

Quizzes: I will give short quizzes in class, usually but not necessarily always announcing them in advance. Missed quizzes can only be made up for unavoidable absences such as serious illness or official university business. Proper documentation is required.

Grading: There are two schemes, and for each student, I will pick the one that gives the higher grade.
